### Duties

The postholder will carry out two analytical tasks:

1. Produce a 'Gap Analysis' that explains the best practice for ethical and anti-racist practices in research fieldwork by international standards, and where there is room for improvement at the department and SSD divisional level.

This document is for discussion at the SSD RSG and will include institutional mapping of current activities that promote ethical and anti-racist practices in research fieldwork, within and outside of the University.

2. Co-develop a Code of Conduct (CoC) for ethical and anti-racist practices in research fieldwork, with experienced fieldworkers in the department. This will include:
  - a. Assembling materials, based on international best practice, that could be considered for inclusion in the CoC

- b. Working with the SoGE Fieldworkers' Network to agree the content and structure for the CoC
- c. Drafting sections of the CoC
- d. Consulting with staff across SSD to fill gaps in the CoC
- e. Finally, re-drafting the Code of Conduct

### **Duration**

We expect that each of these two tasks will take 35 hours to complete. You will be free to do this work whenever you wish, provided the work is complete by the end of March 2021.

### **Selection criteria**

The successful candidate will have:

- A keen interest in promoting anti-racist and ethical practices in research, especially fieldwork
- Previous experience of conducting fieldwork for data collection
- Strong skills in qualitative analysis
- Excellent written and verbal communication skills
- The ability to work independently

*The successful candidate should have the right to work in the UK.*
